Marine Corps Coastal City Flyover

Four AH-1W Super Cobras from Marine Light Attack Helicopter Squadron 367 are scheduled to perform a flyover along the coast of five Orange County cities on Sunday, July 4. Their coastal flight will begin in Huntington Beach and continue south to Newport Beach, Laguna Beach, Dana Point, San Clemente and will end at Camp Pendleton. Their estimated flight time (for the entire route) is from 7 p.m. until 7:15 p.m. Since Newport Beach is early in their flight, they are expected to arrive over our coast before 7:05 p.m. If you are by the beach Sunday evening, please cheer on these Marine Corps pilots!

Little Corona Closed Through Sunday

On Friday, July 2, a break in a sewer force main caused a 3,000 gallon spill near the intersection of Ridge Route & Newport Coast Dr. Irvine Ranch Water District owns and maintains the line and its crews have been working on repairs.

Some of the spilled sewage reached the storm drain and necessitated the closure of Little Corona Beach by the Orange County Health Care Agency's Environmental Health Division. All of Little Corona is currently closed to swimming, surfing and diving through Sunday, July 4.

The Health Care Agency is following a state law which requires a beach to be closed if a sewage spill enters a storm drain and there is no diversionary measure in place that would prevent the water from entering the ocean. There is usually a 72-hour mandatory closure period, but it is the Health Care Agency's decision as to when to the beach will reopen.
